Community

The British Council School is a bilingual and bi-cultural non selective co-educational independent day school serving the Spanish community in Madrid. The school was founded in 1940 as the first British School in Spain. Our long experience in teaching and learning has made the British Council School one of the most prestigious schools in the world. More than 10,000 students, Spanish and other nationalities, have studied in our classrooms, and many of them have achieved senior positions in industry and government later in life. The school is part of the British Council, the official UK institution that promotes Education, English Language and Cultural Relations in the world.

School

An annual cohort of 132 students join us at 2 years of age and graduate at the age 18. Approximately 2,000 students are currently on roll from Nursery to Year 13. The school is a member of the National Association of British Schools in Spain (NABSS), the European Council of International Schools (ECIS) and the Council for International Schools (CIS). The School underwent a British Schools Overseas (BSO) inspection in April 2015 and was graded as **“Outstanding”** overall and in all categories. (Inspection report is available on the website).

Curriculum

From 2 to 16 years of age, students follow the English National Curriculum and Spanish Language and Social Studies following the Spanish National Curriculum.









At 16 (in Year 11/Grade 10 US system) all students take IGCSE Cambridge Examinations and International GCSEs (Edexcel). The majority of students take 10 IGCSE or International GCSE examinations. Subjects are listed below.

In Year 12 and 13 (Grades 11 and 12 US system) students complete the British Council School BiBac Programme (Bilingual Baccalaureate). This broad programme of study is the Spanish National Baccalaureate Programme (Bachillerato Español) and students can choose to study subjects through the medium of English or Spanish. There are 3 pathways students can choose from according to their future career interests. These are Technological, Health Sciences or Social Sciences & Humanities. The subjects covered are below.

Community Service Projects

All students in Year 12 follow our wide-reaching Community Service Program which involves working with Madrid Elderly Community, support and collaboration on initiatives related to our school Foundation which fundraises for investigation into cancer and an optional visit to a Romanian Orphanage at the end of Year 12. Students also collaborate with the Down Madrid Foundation.

Work-shadowing Experience

All Year 12 students are offered a short work-shadowing experience at the end of Year 11. Students can experience a professional environment of their choice.

Foreign Languages

Students follow a challenging programme of study in two languages over 16 years and can obtain C2 level in the Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR) in Spanish and English. To certify students' level of English, they are also asked to take the Cambridge Proficiency Examination (C2). The school also offers the students preparation for the Foreign Language Examinations in French, German and Chinese.

Academic results (2018)

EvAU RESULTS (SPANISH UNIVERSITY ENTRANCE EXAMS) 2018:

BiBac® - Year 13

100% of our year 13 students succeeded in EvAU (Evaluación para el acceso a la Universidad). The average in the EvAU was 7.83 out of 10.

IGCSE & International GCSE

100% succeeded and achieved record results for our school. 96% of our results were A* - C or 9 – 4 and 62% of our results were A*/A or 9 – 7. Excellent results in Mathematics, Science, Languages, Humanities, Expressive Arts, PE, Computing, all contribute to this amazing achievement.

BiBac® Prizes 2018

1 student received the “Premio Extraordinario de Bachillerato” – Prize for Spanish Baccalaureate (out of a total of 25 best students in Comunidad de Madrid) after several official exams.

2 students whose grades in the EvAU/Spanish University entrance exams in 2018 were in the Top 100 received a Certificate of “Mención Honorífica” from the Universidad Complutense de Madrid as did the British Council School.
